### **A N O T E F R O M O U R P A S T O R**

When I was a young pastor I was in the church kitchen chatting with three women. The subject arose of a decision made at church of which they were unaware. I told them that we had announced it on Sunday morning.

"No one pays attention to that."

"Well, it was in the newsletter," I said.

And another woman said, "People do not read that."

"Well, we talked about it at the board meeting," I replied.

"Well, people do not go to those meetings."

"Well, how are you supposed to find out things?" I asked.

Things have not changed much over the years. Every so often someone will share their ignorance on something church-related. It will be in the newsletter, bulletin, on the website, and announced on Sunday. And this brings me to this minor point: how many members read the newsletter? In college, the story circulated about some professor and term papers. Some students wondered if they read all of them. One student inserted a line in their paper, "Put a red mark if you have read this far." I am tempted. A lot of time and effort (and name-calling of this computer machine on my part) go into this document. Chris edits the many articles and reports related to our church. Take time to read and appreciate all we are doing as a church.

But that is only a minor point. I wonder when the author of Hebrews wrote, "but we do see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God He might taste death for everyone (*Hebrews 2:9*)." Did all of the audience read it? Did they take it to heart? Or, when Paul wrote, "though He was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, He humbled Himself (*Philippians 2:6-8*)," did the church at Philippi read, understand, and appreciate the import of what Paul wrote? Did they take it to heart?

When the story of the Passion and Resurrection of Jesus was told and explained and written, how many heard it, read it, and took it to heart?

We are in the midst of Lent, 40 days of introspection and self-examination and repentance. Our journey will be aided by the stories of the Passion in all four Gospels. They are of varying lengths and details but all are vital to what happens in the last days of Jesus. Additionally, some of the previous chapters tell of the concern, the disposition, and the attitude of Jesus as "He set His face to go to Jerusalem. (*Luke 9:51*)" Your spiritual life, your soul, will be enriched by this reading and pondering of God's gift to us.

We spend time surfing the internet, reading the sports page, or our horoscope. If we spent the same amount of time reading the Bible, our lives will be enriched as we heed God's Word.

May God's blessings continue to abound.

Thanks to all that participated in our first Jesus' Closet Celebration! It was a great night of fellowship, music, food and looking back and looking forward on this ministry. We had almost 40 people come in spite of the rain and spring break activities. Special thanks to Armando Vera, Corey Barboza and Ryan Barboza for the fantastic music. #### Other activities to come:

If you know of anyone in the Hispanic community that might like to register their children for VBS, we have all of the information and registration forms in Spanish if needed.

We are looking at providing English and Spanish lessons this summer. If you know anyone interested in learning either language or you are interested in conversational Spanish, please let me know at heather.thomas@gsquaredwireless.com. We already have a strong interest in both. Stay tuned!

Conexión Américas has offered to host a seminar on the Hispanic community and immigration. This subject is important to us all and they will provide information on the pros and cons of how our immigration system works. I have learned so much that I did not know on the subject. This is a great opportunity for us to educate ourselves as this issue becomes more and more prevalent every day.

#### God's Vision for the future

God is asking me to step out of my comfort zone and work for him on a larger scale. He wants something bigger. Six years ago he put on several of our hearts to get involved with the Hispanic Community. Jesus' Closet was born. It started small and has grown to serve more than 500 children each year with warm clothing and a few toys for Christmas! We have also ministered to these people with other services while they were here. Over 100 people have accepted Christ! Hundreds of kids have been registered through Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. Flu shots have been given. Conexión Américas has provided valuable resources for anything from preparing taxes, to buying a house to learning to navigate in a new country.

Throughout this time we have been called to serve in other ways. One year we held a Back-to-School festival and provided backpacks, school supplies, music and fellowship to the community. Another time we helped Woodbine UMC provide supplies to kids in need within

their community. We have bought food for the hungry when needed, and hosted a Bible camp in Dickson, Tennessee, which served 72 children while their mothers were at a retreat on the same campus.

We have reached out to the congregation and community to provide Spanish lessons and served 25+ students. Our local high school supports us with translators. Local vendors provide food, shopping carts, Bibles etc. And one of the most beautiful things that has happened is to watch the support for this ministry grow from a handful of volunteers and people that want to get involved to over 100 volunteers each year. This ministry is touching and changing hearts!

**Please join us and pray for us as we explore what God has in store for NFUMC. I believe he is calling us to great things and I am more than excited about the opportunity to say "YES, Lord! Here I am!"**

For three years he traveled a path of tests, treatments, and hospital stays which governed his family's existence and tested their strength, courage, and faith. Connor and his family have been on our prayer concern list for month. We continue to pray for them and to thank God daily for the opportunity to be a part of Connor's life!

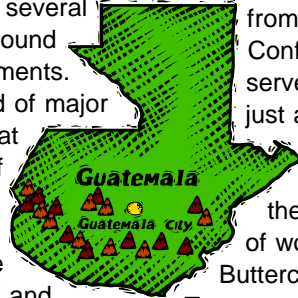

## MISSION TO GUATEMALA

Plans for the 2011 Mission Team to Guatemala are beginning to take form. Dean Cole, of the Cole Family Foundation, presented a video tour of this year's worksite at our weekly organizational meeting. Xeabaj (pronounced Sha-a-bak) is a remote village in the mountains near Chichicastenango. Their school is not large enough to handle the 440 students who attend. Currently several classes are being held on parts of the play ground in areas divided only by clapboard wall segments. Additionally, the bathroom facilities are in need of major improvements. Guatemala is a country that faces constant struggles with the impact of heavy rains and mudslides. The existing temporary classrooms at Xeabaj literally have trenches through them to carry away the flowing water. Yet, they are frequently flooded and unusable.

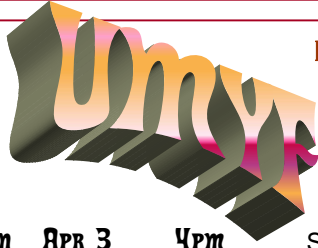
### S E C O N D S U N D A Y B R E A K F A S T

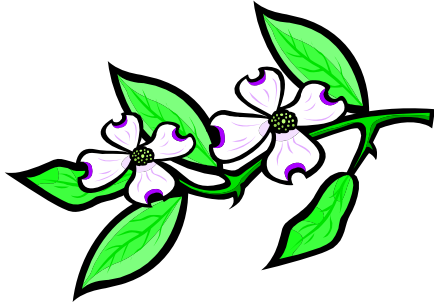

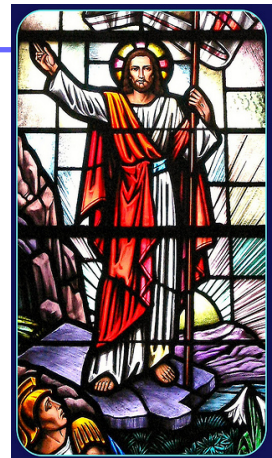
