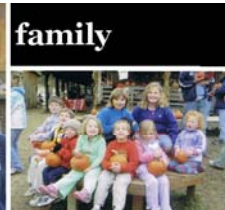

I took a three-week course, "Christian Preaching in the Old Testament," that was wonderful. This followed the Tennessee Annual conference.

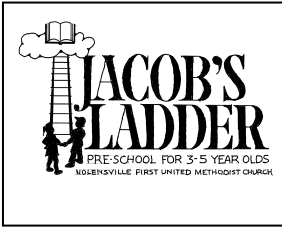

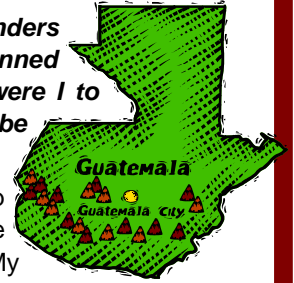

THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

This is one of a series of articles about the United Methodist Church, its purpose, structure, and mission.

"Follow Me."

The greatest expression of love for Jesus Christ is to follow Him wherever He wants us to go. That is how we discover hope. We lay down our priorities of the day, see through the distractions of this world and follow. Jesus taught that lesson in John 21:15-19. He asked His loyal disciple, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" When Simon Peter assured Jesus the answer was "yes," Jesus instructed, "Follow Me."

The United Methodist Church seeks to follow by making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. It is an exciting time to be a part of the United Methodist family. An emerging global conversation is drawing the church back to our Wesleyan heritage and focusing our work in a way that allows us to spread more and greater hope. This work is unfolding in four areas of focus:

- ✘ Developing principled Christian leaders for the church and the world
- ✘ Creating new places for new people and renewing existing congregations
- ✘ Engaging in ministry with the poor
- ✘ Stamping out the killer diseases of poverty by improving health globally

We focus in these four areas to spread the Gospel. It is the United Methodist way to discern God's activity among us and to respond. It is living out our Wesleyan heritage as an impassioned Christian movement of every color, background and condition.

The connectional* United Methodist Church believes we should spend our days sharing the great story, even when it leads to unfamiliar places and works. Because of that connection, we endeavor to live gracefully, as one unified global community that does no harm, does good and stays in love with God. Daily we rediscover and share the hope we know in Jesus Christ.

The church of rediscovering and sharing hope is not solely about Sunday, nor is it about buildings. It is a 365-days-a-year experience where people seeking a community can become involved in ways — many of them non-traditional — that their lives may be touched. It might mean volunteering with groups outside the church building or making online connections. In fact, "church" may start as a day care, a youth-group ski trip, a basketball league or something that solves an important human need in the secular realm, such as Nothing But Nets (www.nothingbutnets.net/partners). It is about finding real-world entry points for persons who feel overwhelmed, afraid or vulnerable. The encounter between Jesus and Peter in John 21 changed everything for the church, which might never have begun without this profound interaction.

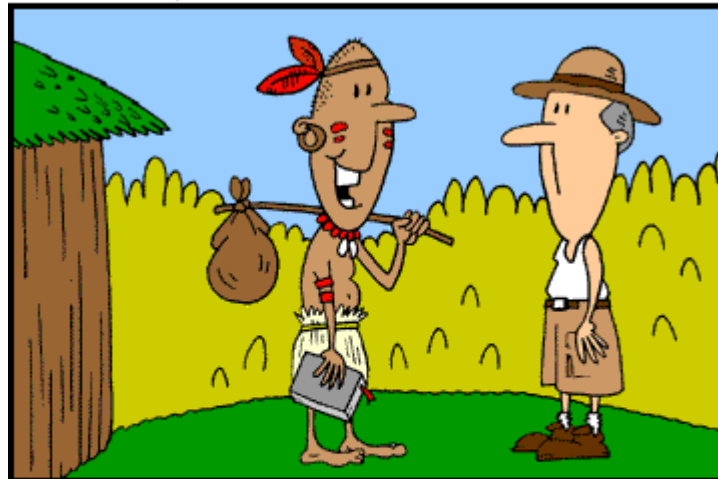

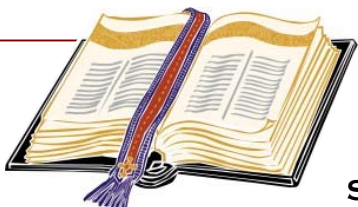

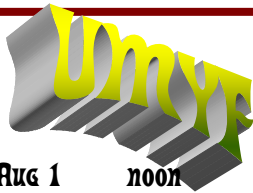

VBS a Great Success!

Our 2011 Vacation Bible School was held from July 17

through July 21. "PandaMania" was the theme and it was wildly successful! We had 155 children registered and an average nightly attendance of nearly 120.

The mission project for this year was to raise funds to purchase school supplies for kids in areas hit by tornados this past spring. Each night started with the youth dressed as pandas, trekkers, and trees to form the notorious "Bamboo Crew" and leading the Party Time Sing and Play. Once dismissed, the twelve crews of kids and their leaders went off to a variety of activities. The kids were entertained with Wild Bible Adventures, as we revisited stories about God's Creation, Elijah vs. Baal, Jonah's experience in the whale, Hannah's prayers, and Peter's recollection of Jesus' last days. The crews were guided by leaders of Crazy Crafts in making kaleidoscope glasses, picture frames, and panda drums. On top of these, the kids decorated backpacks and bookmarks for the VBS mission project. Chadder's Movie Mania teased the kids with suspenseful clips from Pop's Panda Paradise with the final episode revealing the culprit behind the case of the missing pandas. Bamboo Blast Games had youth and volunteers leading recreational activities which inevitably seemed to

end up with some or most of those around damp, wet, or even soaked. Each night, the children were encouraged to bring donations for the mission project, and if the \$600 target was met, Pastor Jim would shave his beard. Panda Pete (aka Josh Mucci) was coerced into upping the ante to try to raise \$800, and in return, he would get his head shaved. Once totaled, the effort raised over \$1200 and hair came off in front of an excited crowd of kids, parents, and volunteers!

All in all, volunteers from both Nolensville First United Methodist and Ebenezer United Methodist worked together to create a wonderful and memorable Vacation Bible School for so many kids in our churches and surrounding community. Thanks to all who participated!

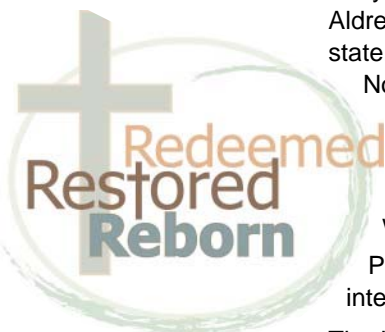




