A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

They say insanity is doing the same thing over and over and expecting different results.

I am glad you did not see me on Monday afternoon trying to put together a stand for the television. I laid out all 4,236 parts of hardware, carefully read the first page of instructions, and began. About three and a half hours later, it was done. At times, I was on the brink of insanity as I tried repeatedly to get the long widget to align with the cam thingamabob. Again. And again. And again. I finally got it done. (Do not tell Linda about the extra pieces, nor that the drawers open upside down.) I hate reading and following directions. I tend to skim them and get ahead of myself.

I have had the Charge Conference forms hanging over my head for the last few weeks. Again, more instructions. They are actually quite revelatory. We are asked to look at recent statistics, reflect on them, and then set goals for where we are going as a church. It is an involved process that asks each part of the church to look at their part and answer questions: Sunday School classes, choir, youth, etc.

I looked at some of the stats. They give us information that is challenging. Now, the tendency and the reaction of many is that these reports are a waste of time. That attitude is prevalent in most of society and in some of our churches. In a paper I have read, the information was there. 3% of people are highly successful in their lives, 30% are moderately successful, and 67% just exist. The main difference is that 3% have written specific goals for their lives. 30% have a general idea of where they are going, but no written goals. The other 67% just exist. What a difference these goals would have for our congregation! And yet, sadly, too many congregations just exist.

I want to encourage you to come up with some specific goals for where God wants us to go. How many should be attending church worship in two years? What kind of growth in staff do we need? What kind of improvements can we make to the building that houses so many church activities? How many new study groups can we start? And, what kind of wildly imaginative ideas can we envision.

Our motivation is in small part to be faithful to the vision of those first members of this congregation. What did they hope this congregation could be for this community in the Kingdom of God? Would they be pleased?

A far more important rationale is what God wants from and for this congregation. Is He pleased with our faithfulness? Is there more we can be and do? Can we be smarter/wiser in our efforts?

I look forward to our discussions about this for the next few weeks before Charge Conference. What is most important is that we are about God's will. The 67% are blown about by winds of chance and fad. May we be empowered by that Divine Wind of the Holy Spirit.

The process will not be easy, but it will be a lot easier than me putting a piece of furniture together.

You may drop off any clothing or toy donations in the New Fellowship Hall behind the partitions. Please do not put merchandise on the chairs.

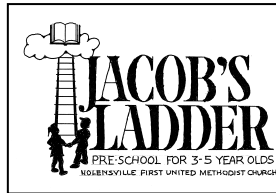

Have you ever tried to take a single leaf and make a new plant from it?

Granted, there may be some varieties for which this will work, but by and large, you need to have several leaves connected to the vine in order for roots to take hold and several vines planted together to make a healthy plant. For several weeks now the children in Jacob's Ladder have watched our vine cuttings take roots, and as our budding scientists paint flower pots and plant their vines, they are using the above scripture to help improve so many different skills: communication, fine motor, observation, listening, and faith development. We ask them how we can stay connected to God in order to produce fruit and take care of His creation. After hearing answers like "being nice and kind to others, talking to God, and learning His stories," one young fellow responded, "Ms. Terri, you just have to love Him!"

Jacob's Ladder is just one of the vines that God has nurtured at NFUMC. We are proud to be planted together with Jesus' Closet, UMW, our youth mission outreach, GraceWorks contributors of goods and services, our Early Responders for UMCOR, and the Guatemala mission team, just to name a few of the vines which reach out to bear fruit. With Charge Conference coming soon, let us all be in prayer that God will continue to nurture our mission vines as we continue to answer God's call to love one another and make disciples for Christ.

THE DOT ARNOLD SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Dot Arnold Scholarship goes to qualifying seniors who will be attending a four-year college and have been active in the music program at Nolensville First UMC. The scholarship is \$500 per year, for four consecutive years. It is sent to the college and is renewable when a student completes the follow-up requirements each summer before they return to school the following fall.

The DAS was set up to honor Dot Arnold. For many years, Dot served as a member of the choir, as organist, pianist and choir director at our church. Dot was and is involved in the music ministry for more than 40 years. We hope to have enough money in the fund to help eight students each year in the future. That says a lot about this church, about the music ministry of our church, and about the longevity of the music that one woman made sure that NFUMC had to minister to its members and the community.
