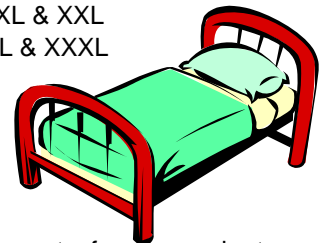
ROOM IN THE INN

The Red Cross has already had to cancel more than 60 blood drives along the East Coast due to Hurricane Irene, resulting in the shortfall of more than 1,500 units of blood. It is expected that additional blood drives will be postponed in the aftermath due to storm damage.

Before Hurricane Irene came ashore, the American Red Cross moved blood products to the areas most likely to be affected so that these products will be available during and after the storm. The Red Cross is urging immediate blood and platelet donations in unaffected areas.

Giving blood now helps ensure it is available in the aftermath of any storm when conditions may prevent donors from traveling to blood drives.

Columbia District Fall 2011 Trip

The VIM will go to Trenton, Georgia, to help repair damages from the 2011 Spring Storms in the Dade County region of Georgia and possibly the northeast area of Alabama. Trenton is 10 miles south of I-40 on I-59.

We will be staying at Trenton UMC, which has a nice kitchen and hot showers for our comfort. We will depart after church on September 18 and return Friday evening, September 23. As many as seventeen can ride in the Epworth UMC bus, and we will have a couple other vehicles for transport.

We request that \$100 per person be made payable to Columbia District VIM for meal, transportation and support for TUMC's service. *Note:* this is not a requirement, as we do not want to inhibit anyone from being a part of this special opportunity to serve Him!

The deadline for signing up is September 4, but if you really want to go and cannot set plans by then, please make contact me. Work activity will consist of something for everyone, skilled or unskilled: clean-up, painting, sheetrock repairs, trim, door and window repairs, etc.

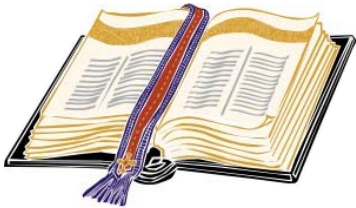

Now Available - Electronic Giving

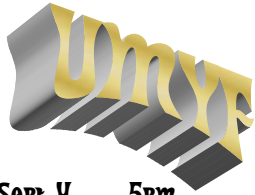

FROM THE TRUSTEES

The trustees are happy to report the sewer has been connected at the church and the parsonage. Many thanks to Jacob's Ladder for assuming a large portion of the financial responsibility. Please take a moment to thank Terri for making it possible.

Twelve years ago members of this church saw a need for a larger fellowship hall and an education/office wing. The Fellowship Hall was to be a place for the church family and community to gather for fellowship, food, and drink. A small membership took a leap of faith, raised approximately \$600,000 and borrowed approximately \$600,000 to achieve that goal. Recently, it has come to light that we, as church members, are no longer restricting food and drink to the Fellowship Hall. Trustees spent some time last week cleaning several ugly spills in the Sanctuary carpet. This is God's house and our sanctuary is a historic building. Please help us respect and preserve it by restricting food and drink to the fellowship hall.

As many of you have noticed and mentioned, the Bell Tower is in desperate need of painting. Water has gotten behind the paint which has mildewed and is now peeling off the wood. The Trustees are planning to have it painted and to have the painting completed by November if sufficient funds are provided. Two thousand five hundred dollars is presently available for this effort. A very rough estimate at this time for painting the Bell Tower and street face of the Sanctuary is between \$6,000 – \$8,000.

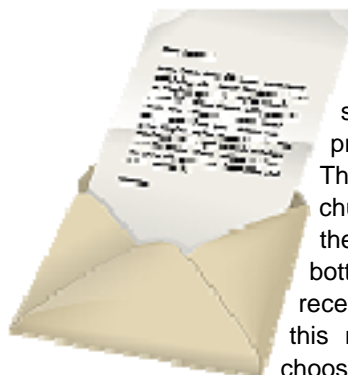
Please be in prayer that the Lord will lead us to find these funds over and above the \$6,500 per week needed for operation of church.
